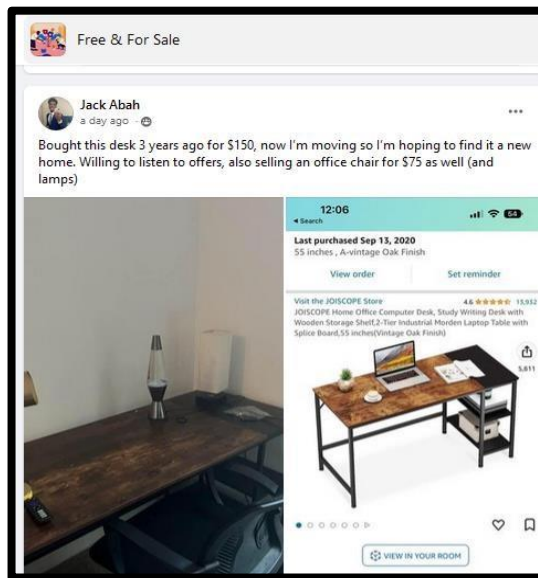
## Housing:
